



- Policies and Procedures -

Housing

1. Students will live with a host home for entirety of the school year.
2. Host home will provide continental breakfast options for student during this time.
3. Lunches can be provided through The Foundry's meal plan as part of tuition.
4. The Host, Student and Foundry Director will together set curfew guidelines and house rules.
5. Students must live in host home provided in years one and two of The Foundry.
6. In year three of The Foundry, students may live in an apartment or house without host.
7. Students who live in the Memphis area can live at home and commute. This will not affect the cost of tuition.

Student Life

1. Students may have required night and/or weekend events to attend as part of school which will take priority over personal and work schedules. Students will be given adequate notice for such events.
2. Students must provide their own transportation while attending school.
3. Students may work a job, but cannot work on Sundays, Wednesdays, and cannot be a full-time schedule.
4. Students will not be allowed to date or be in a relationship during their first year of school.
5. Students may not spend time alone with persons of the opposite gender.
6. Students will commit to abstain from all sexual activity, foul and degrading language and conversation, rated R movies, explicit music, drinking alcohol and all drug use.
7. Students will agree to curfew guidelines and all house rules set.
8. Students will carry themselves in a mature and presentable way on and off campus, representing themselves, The Foundry, and God well.
9. Students will be expected to dress appropriately for days at school. No shorts or tank tops to be worn.
10. Failure to cooperate spiritually or academically will get student on probation and/or expelled.

Academics

1. Students will be going through Berean School of the Bible while in The Foundry. This is a branch of Global University the Assemblies of God's online University.
2. Classes taken are not transferable to other colleges, but are used by the Assemblies of God to obtain credentials.
3. Students will have three Practical Ministry Books complete with book report for each school year.
4. An internship will be done the last quarter of each year.
5. Students are strongly encouraged to attend a Community College or University alongside The Foundry.
6. Each student will have an individualized plan, unique to them and the call on their life.
7. Students attending a Community College or University will be required 4-6 hours at First Assembly Campus each week.
8. Students attending The Foundry only will be required 10-12 hours.
